The purpose of this letter is to notify you of important information regarding your child's school based on new protocol for measuring the academic performance of Nevada public schools. Among these measures are academic proficiency on state assessments, English language proficiency for students for whom English is a second language, and assessment participation rates.

The Nevada School Performance Framework (NSPF) is based on a five-star classification system with five being the highest level of performance. Quest has been identified as a 2-star for middle school and a 1-star for elementary school. We have high expectations for student achievement and growth and are working to improve every student's performance. This is done by providing differentiated instruction for our students as well as professional growth and development for our teachers and staff. Our goal is to always provide research-based best practices for all of our students particularly in the areas of math, reading and writing as well as science and social studies.
